

6. Lessons for Today

- a. The LORD (symbolized by the Ark) went into the dangerous river first as Israel's protector. That same God is with us today. Isaiah 43:2a When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you.
- b. Although we may not see what God is doing, it does not mean he isn't working.
- c. Step out in faith. Sometimes you need to get your feet wet. James 2:26 As the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without deeds is dead.
- d. God is always leading. The question is are we ready to follow?
- e. Crossing your Jordan is moving to a higher relationship with the living God a life centered in faith and obedience.
