

This prophecy concerns the expansion of the <u>Greek</u> Empire and the extreme suffering the <u>Jews</u> would face under the eventual reign of Antiochus IV Epiphanes.

One little horn (echo of <u>7:8</u>) rises with particular consequence for God's people: Antiochus IV Epiphanes

This little horn is characterized by immense ego that threw <u>truth</u> to the ground (12) for personal aggrandizement.

He will rise up against God Himself, but shall be broken – <u>but by no human hand!</u> (25b)

Why was this important for the Jews in Daniel's time?

- 1. The Jews would never again have a kingdom of their own. No more kings.
- 2. Their hope must remain focused on the King whose arrival and power is by no human hand (ch2), the <u>Son of Man</u> (ch7).

Set your hearts and hope upon God's King alone.

Why is it important for us today?

- 1. Jesus told His disciples in John 15:18 that they would be hated.
- 2. The Son of Man alone reigns.

How does this apply to me?
